The Chinese Minor requires a minimum of **15 upper-division credits** listed under CHIN. At least 6 credits have to be taken at the University of Utah. All courses must be passed with a grade of C or better. CR/NC may NOT be elected for these courses.

Students must complete the lower-division language sequence of 1010, 1020, 2010, and 2020, or the equivalent, before enrolling in CHIN 3010 or 3060. - **CHIN 3010** Third-Year Mandarin Chinese I (3)
For students who took CHIN 2020 at the college level, received a score of 5 on the AP Exam, or equivalent
- **CHIN 3060** Advanced Chinese Grammar & Composition (3)
For students with at least 1.5 years of extensive experience in a Chinese-speaking environment, such as missionaries or heritage speakers

CHIN 3020 Third-Year Mandarin Chinese II (3) - This course is the continuation of either CHIN 3010 or 3060.
